

Rushing Rivers and Fall Foliage Welcome Outdoor Adventurers to Kentucky

From Thrill Seekers To Family Travelers, The Bluegrass State Has It All



KENTUCKY, October 2019: Kentucky's vast forests, rushing rivers and pioneer spirit make it the ultimate outdoor adventure destination this fall. From one of the most challenging white-water rafting routes in the United States to peaceful wildlife viewing, Kentucky offers something for everyone, from the thrill seeker to the family traveler.

"From the peaks of Daniel Boone National Forest to the caverns of Mammoth Caves, Kentucky is the ultimate destination for a fall getaway," says Jay Hall, Acting Commissioner of the Kentucky Department of Tourism. "The state's immersive cultural events, fantastic scenery and welcoming people ensure the trip of a lifetime."

Below, is a selection of outdoor adventure, activities and events from around the state.

White Water Rafting, Russel Fork River

Russel Fork is one of the most challenging stretches of commercially runnable whitewater in the United States. Its class IV and V+ rapids are only considered passable in the late fall when the John Flannagan Dam releases water. Five to ten-foot drops in the river have earned it names like "Tower Falls," "Triple Drop," and the infamous "El Horrendo," which is the biggest commercially run waterfall in the country. Canoeing, Mammoth Cave National Park

Mammoth Cave National Park may be known for the largest mapped cave system in the world, but its fall transformation above ground is just as stunning as its caverns below. The thick green woodland transitions in autumn and canoeing along the Green River reveals a vibrant corridor of color. The underground world of the park also changes as a variety of specialty tours allow access to special parts of the cave. Hiking and Rock Climbing, Red River Gorge

Red River Gorge, part of the Daniel Boone National Forest, offers a myriad of trails that immerse hikers in a sea of fall foliage as the forest is awash in color. The area is especially known for its rock climbing, as hundreds of routes of all difficulty levels invite travelers to try their hand climbing the limestone cliff faces. Camping, Land Between the Lakes

America's largest inland peninsula is also a premier destination for fall boating, fishing and wildlife viewing. A 3.5-mile driving loop allows easy viewing of elk, bison and countless native birds, while the Golden Pond Planetarium offers a 40-foot dome theatre for fascinating astronomy shows. From the Fenton Campground campers can launch a boat in Kentucky Lake and enjoy some of the country's best crappie fishing. Mountain Biking & Cycling, The Parklands of Floyds Fork

Located just outside of Louisville, The Parklands of Floyds Fork is a network of five parks with extensive biking and hiking trails as well and beautiful picnic areas and peaceful paddling routes. The Turkey Run Park mountain biking trails include the Chinkapin Trail, which has a backwoods feel through an upland forest, and the Wild Hyacinth Trail, which takes riders through forests, waterfalls, bottomlands and meadows. Elk Viewing Tours, Jenny Wiley State Resort Park

Elk were reintroduced to Kentucky in 1997 and the population is thriving, with an estimated 10,000 elk in the state alone. Knowledgeable guides lead these tours on crisp autumn mornings, discussing habitat and wildlife protection efforts with guests while searching for the beautiful herds.
