Bourbon Events, Distillers, Expansions Enhance Guests' Experiences

#### **Distilleries**

Wenzel Distillery opens new facility in Covington - Wenzel Distillery cut the ribbon on a brand-new distillery and tasting room in downtown Covington in July 2025. The new facility is the result of a \$6 million investment and is located in a revitalized 1916 Packard Auto building. **Midway welcomes new distillery and experience -** Bluegrass Distillers has officially opened its new \$8 million distillery at the historic Elkwood Farm in Midway, Kentucky. Founder Sam Rock began the brand in 2013 with a crockpot and self-financing, a story he shared at the grand opening. The new 62-acre property will allow the distillery, which started on the back of a local brewery, to grow its production and become a major destination for bourbon and rye whiskey. Army Veterans to open distillery in Somerset - Horse Soldier Bourbon, founded by retired Green Berets, is opening a distillery in Somerset in July 2026, marking America's 250th anniversary. The \$200 million facility is being built on a 200-acre former golf course overlooking Lake Cumberland. It aims to create jobs and boost tourism, becoming a southern anchor of the Kentucky Bourbon Trail. **Heaven Hill Fills First Barrel at New Distillery** Heaven Hill Distillery has begun production at its new Springs Distillery in Bardstown, Kentucky, marking a significant return to its original home almost three decades the original facility was destroyed in a fire. This \$200 million project will initially produce 150,000 barrels annually, with future capacity to expand to 450,000 barrels. Rhythm River Distillery working to open distillery and tasting room - Rhythm River Distillery in Henderson is scheduled to open by the end of fall 2025. This \$5 million project will transform the former Henderson Municipal Power & Light campus into a distillery and entertainment venue. It will feature a stillhouse, visitor center, cocktail bar, and barrel storage. **Barrel House Distilling Co. to open production facility and event space in Cynthiana –** The Lexington based Barrel House Distilling Co. is planning to expand their production facility 30-miles north into Cynthiana. In addition to distilling bourbon and various other spirits, the \$1.8 million project will yield an event space capable of hosting up to 100 guests. The 30-acre property is expected to open in phases through 2025. The new location, which is under construction does not have an opening date, will be a

Green River Distilling Co. opens tasting room on Louisville's Whiskey Row - Green River Distilling Co. has opened a new 4,400-square-foot tasting room on Louisville's Whiskey Row. The space features a horseshoe-shaped bar, a retail section with bottle engraving, and a hidden speakeasy. Visitors can enjoy walk-in tastings and a unique "Fill-Your-Spirits" experience, where they fill their own barrel-strength whiskey jug. Chicken Cock Whiskey to open tasting room in Nulu - Chicken Cock Whiskey, which opened a tasting room in Bardstown last year, is expanding to a second location in Louisville's NuLu neighborhood. The new bar will be at 821 E. Market Street, the former home of Gertie's Whiskey Bar. The 2,400-square-foot venue is double the size of the Bardstown location, Circa 1856, and will be a brand and hospitality space. This expansion makes Chicken Cock the first non-distilling producer to have tasting rooms in both Bardstown and Louisville. This tasting room, formerly a bank, will feature a bar, an outdoor patio with a fire pit, and a retail area. It will offer by-appointment-only tasting experiences, including custom cocktails.
